Rosh Hashanah

Today we are celebrating Rosh Hashanah, which is the Jewish New Year. It actually begins tonight at sunset and continues through nightfall on October 1st. Rosh Hashanah is a holiday of giving. Thus, you all will receive a nice apple after the service, and we will take up a First Fruits offering. Traditionally on this holiday, the people would eat sliced apples dipped in honey. So, an American tradition (caramel apples) originated in Israel. There's a fun fact for you to remember.

Rosh Hashanah is one of Israel's most important celebrations. This holiday is traced back to the "Feasts of Trumpets." Therefore, today we will start worship with the sound of a Shofar, a ram's horn that Israel would use at the beginning of any celebration or call to battle. Also, this holiday is the birthday of the universe, the day God created Adam and Eve. I believe that is a wonderful thing to celebrate!! Our God is an awesome Creator, and "His creation displays His invisible attributes, His Eternal power and Divine nature." (Romans 1:20)
