I am so thankful to each one of you for all the love and support you have given me over this last year!! Thank you for all your prayers, compassion, hugs, patience, faithfulness to come to church, willingness to help me and others in little and big things, and most important - your love and commitment to our Lord Jesus, which makes you over the top WONDERFUL!!! I will be forever grateful for each one of you!! I love you all!!

We all have so much to be thankful for in America, like clean water, shelter, heat, safety, freedom, so much food, good roads, freedom to worship, education, friends, family, and the list goes on!! We are blessed!! I encourage you on Thanksgiving Day to give thanks with your family around the dinner table, but do remember this:

We are blessed in America because of the sacrifices that were made by the people that first started our nation, and because of the help given to us by the Native American Indians. Without their help, and especially from Squanto, the Pilgrims would not have survived. The first people to come here and who settled Jamestown were lovers of Gold, which that did not bring them success. ("The love of money is the root of all evil." 1 Timothy 6:10) The second group that came from England were called the "Separatists". They loved England, but they loved God and religious freedom more. They left England and all they owned, because they did not have freedom of worship, and moved to Holland, where there was freedom. There they had to work in factories instead of farm, so in September of 1620, a group of "Separatists" boarded a little ship known as the Mayflower, with 102 passengers. A few other people, called "Strangers" came to work in the New World and some came for adventure. There was probably some arguments during the 65 days that it took the Mayflower to cross the stormy Atlantic Ocean, but the different groups respected each other and had good character, so they were able to work together. Oh my, how Americans today need to remember how to do that!!!

A wonderful long story, short, is that the Pilgrims faced many hardships both on the Mayflower and after they landed, in that first year. There were challenges like: No shelter, trees needing cleared and logged for building, living together in close quarters, very cold weather, not enough food or medical supplies, with great sickness, and fear of the unknown. BUT, through faith in God, answered prayer (like rain for 3 days straight after a drought) and the help from Squanto, who helped them learn how to farm and hunt in the New World, a new nation was birthed! Our Heavenly Father chose a group of people that loved Him above all things to begin America; so please know that He still has plans and a calling on the USA. May we all be thankful this week and every day, and continue to pray for God's will and Awakening in our nation!!
