Rosh Hashanah

(Begins Sept. 18th through Yom Kippur on
Sept. 28th)



The Jewish Holiday of Rosh Hashanah is generally known as the New Year's Day of the Jewish calendar, but has a four-fold meaning.

It is the Day of Judgment, the Day of Remembrance, the Day of the New Year, and the Day Of Shofar Blowing!

- 1) It is the Day of Judgment—Jews across the world examine their past deeds and ask for forgiveness for their sins.
- 2) It is the Day of Remembrance—As Jews remember the history of their people and pray for Israel.
- 3) It is New Year's Day—Celebrated with holiday greeting cards, special prayers, and eating sweet foods such as apples dipped in honey (to ensure sweetness in the New Year.)
- 4) It is the Day of Shofar Blowing—The Shofar (an ancient musical horn usually made of a ram's horn) is blown in temples to herald the beginning of the 10-day period known as High Holy Days. The sound of the horn is meant to awake the hearers from their spiritual slumber, to make them aware of their actions and their consequences.

The ten days starting with Rosh Hashanah and ending with Yom Kippur are commonly known as The Days of Repentance or the Days of Awe. This is a time for introspection, a time to consider the sins of the previous year and repent. Jews are expected to reach out to friends, loved ones and community members and to apologize for any wrongs they did to them during the year.

In Israel, Rosh Hashanah is the only holiday that lasts for two days as it is considered too important to be observed for only 24 hours. So it is considered one long day of 48 hours.

Known as the Feast of Trumpets, Rosh Hashanah is recorded in the Old Testament book of Leviticus 23:23-25 and also in Numbers 29:1-6
