The Spirit of Elijah

The Prophet Elijah is one of the most well know prophets from the history of Israel in the Bible. He is also known as "the Prophet of Fire" as more than once he called down fire from Heaven. He and Enoch are the only mortals that were blessed to not have to taste death, but were taken straight up to Heaven. Elijah was taken up in a "Chariot of Fire" with "horses of fire"!! Whew!! How glorious!! I believe there may be some things we can learn from this great man of God!!!

Here are some of the miracles God performed through the prayers and prophetic words of Elijah the Prophet. May your faith be inspired as you read these, as we serve the same ALMIGHTY GOD, THE LORD OF HOSTS!!!

1 Kings 17:1. Rain stops falling in Israel after the prayer of Elijah.
 1 Kings 17:2-7. Elijah is fed by ravens.
 1 Kings 17:8-16. Elijah, a widow, and her son all live for a long time eating from a tiny amount of flour and oil that miraculously never runs out during the famine.
 1 Kings 17:17-24. After the widow's son dies, Elijah stretches himself out on the widow's lifeless son, prays for him and he is resurrected!!!

1 Kings 18:1-46. This may be the most well known miracle:
 A contest is held between the

prophets of Baal and Elijah. The contest is to determine which god is real: the God of Elijah, or Baal. **The Prophet Elijah prayed: "O Lord, the God of Abraham, Isaac and Israel, today let it be known that Thou art God in Israel and that I am Thy servant, and that I have done all these things at Thy word.**

Answer me, O Lord, answer me, that this people may know that Thou, O Lord, art God, and that Thou has turned their hearts back again. Then the fire of the Lord fell, and consumed the burn offering and the wood and the stones and the dust, and licked up the water that was in the trench. And when all the people saw it, THEY FELL ON THEIR FACES; and they said, "The Lord, HE IS GOD; the Lord, He is God." (Verses 36-39). Hallelujah!! Glory to God!!

1 Kings 18:45. RAIN returned to Israel, with a "heavy shower".
 1 Kings 18:46. By the power of God, Elijah outran a horse-drawn chariot!!
 1 Kings 19:8. After he was fed bread and water by an angel, Elijah was strengthened, and fasted for 40 days, while walking to Horeb, the mountain of God.
 1 Kings 19:11, 12-18. God passes in front of Elijah, as he is in a cave. There is a powerful wind, an earthquake, a fire, and finally a calm, and the still, small voice of the Lord. Elijah anoints Elisha as a Prophet in his place, and Jehu as King.

2 King 1:1-18. Elijah calls down fire from heaven twice.
2 Kings 2:8. Elijah struck the Jordan River and he and Elisha walked on dry land.
2 Kings 2:11. As the two prophets were walking and talking, **"there appeared a chariot of fire and horses of fire which separated the two of them. And Elijah went up by a whirlwind to heaven."**
2 Kings 2:12-14. Elisha cried out "My father, my father", and saw him no more.
Elisha also "took up the mantle of Elijah" and thus started his ministry of the "Double Portion" from Elijah, starting with the parting of the Jordan River, to return home.
There are many prophecies in the OT from both Elijah and Elisha that all came to pass, and we GIVE GOD ALL THE GLORY!!!
